No. Leg. 35/2006.—The following Act of the Legislature of the State Hayana received the assent of the Governor of Haryana on the 5 October, 2006, and is hereby published for general information:—

BARYANA ACT NO. 31 OF 2006

BHAGAT PHOOL SINGH MANILA VISHWAVID YALAYA KHANPUR KALAN ACT, 2006

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trevablish and incorporate a women university (teaching-cam-affiliating misersity) at Khaupur Kalaar to facilitate and promote women in the field of higher education with special emphasis in emerging areas of Information Technology, Computer Education, Medical Sciences, Bio-technology, Environmentat Studies, Technology and Management Studies, and also to achieve excellence in these and connected todds.

Built enacted by the Legislature of the State of Haryana in the Fifty-seventh heat of the Republic of India as follows: ---

I. (1) This Act may be called Bhagat Phool Singh Mabila Vishwavidyalaya Khampur Kalan Act, 2006.

Short title and commencement,

- (2) It shall come into force at once,
- 2. In this Act and in all Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations made precunder unless the context otherwise requires, ---

Definitions.

- (a) "college" means a college maintained by, or admitted to the privileges of, the University under this Act;
- (b) "employee" means any person appointed by the University, and includes teachers and all other staff of the University;
- (c) "Government" means the Government of the State of Haryana:
- (d) "institution" means an academic institution, not being a college, maintained by, or admitted to the privileges of, the University;
- (c) "principal" means the head of a college, and melades, when there is no principal, a vice-principal duly appointed as such and in the absence of the principal or the vice principal the person for the time being duly appointed to get as the principal;
- (f) "recognised teachers" mean such persons as are approved by the University for the purpose of imparting instruction in a college or an institution admitted to the privileges of the University;



- (g) "She" includes "he".
- (b) "Statutes", "Ordinances" and "Regulations" mean respective Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations of the University of under this Act;
- (i) "University" means the "Bhagat Phoof Singh Ma Vishwavidyalaya Khanpur Kalan" as incorporated and Act; and
- (j) "University teachers" me in professors, readers, lecturers and system persons as may be appointed for imparting insurences, conducting research in the University or in any college institution maintained by the University and designated, teachers by the Ordinances.

lacorporation.

- 3. (1) There shall continue to be a body corporate by the name Bhagat Phoot Singh Mahila Vishwavidyalaya Khanpur Kalan comprising a Chancellor and the Vice-Chancellor of the University, and the members of Fourt, the Executive Council and the Academic Council and all persons, a) may hereafter become or he appointed as such officers or members, so leaps they continue to hold such office or membership.
- (2) The University shall have perpetual succession and a comscal with power to acquire, hold and dispose of property and to contract, autoby the said name sue or be sued.
- (1) The limits of the area within which the University shall exert its powers shall be such as the Government may, from time to time, by notifican specify:

Provided that different areas may be specified for different facility

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law (see time being in force, any college situated within the limits of the area spectually such execution (4) shall, with effect from such date as may be notified as a behalf by the Government, be deemed to be associated with, and admined and privileges of the University and shall cease to be associated in any way with, and admitted to, any privileges of any other University, and different dates may notified for different colleges:

Provided that ---

- (i) any student of an corlege associated with, or admitted the other University before the said date, who was study for any degree or applorna examination of that University shall hold for such study thereof and the University shall hold for such study force in that University for such period as may prescribed by the Statutes, Ordinance or Regulations.
- (ii) any such student may, until any such examination is by the University, be admitted to the examination of other University and be conferred the degree, diplomany other privilege of that University for which equalifies on the result of such examination.

Territorial exercise of powers,

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5. (1) Notwinstanding anything contained in this Act or any other to, for the time being in torce, no person or institution, other than the chiversity, stall confer, grant or osue or hold herself or itself out as entitled to router, grant or issue any degree, diploma or certificate in the specified means of knowledge as greed to it within the territorial prosduction of the University which is identical with or is a colourable imitation of any degree, diploma or certificate conferred, granted or issued by the University.

- Bar on conference, stanting or rooms of degrees, deplement or certificates by unauthorized institutions
- (2) Contravention of the provisions of sub-section (1) shall be a cognizable offence punishable with imprisonment not exceeding three years or with a fine not exceeding ten thousand rupees or with both.
- (3) Where an offence under this section has been committed by an institution, every person incharge of, and responsible to, the institution for the conduct of its business at the time of the commission of the offence, shall be deemed to be guilty of the offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against as per the University rules.
- (4) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-section (3), where an offence made under this section has been committed by an institution and it is proved that the offence has been committed with the consent or connivance of, or that the commission of the offence is attributable to any neglection the part of any partner, director, manager, secretary or other officer of the maximion, such partner, director, manager, secretary or other officer shall also be deemed to be guilty of that offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and surrefied accordingly.

Explanation. — For the purpose of this section "institution" means any body corporate and includes a firm or other association of individuals.

6. The University shall exercise the following powers and perform the following functions, namely: --

Powers and functions of University.

- (a) to provide for research and instruction in such branches of learning as the University may think it fit and to take such steps as it considers necessary for the advancement of learning and dissemination of knowledge;
- (b) to hold examinations and grant such degrees, diplomas and other academic distinctions or titles to persons as may be laid down in the Statutes, Ordinances or Regulations;
- (c) to confer honorary degrees or other distinctions on approved persons in the manner laid down in the Statutes;
- (d) to insurane prizes, medals, research studentships, exhibitions and fellowships;
- (c) to receive gifts, donations or benefactions from the Government

and to receive gifts, donations and consfers of movable of foundwable property from transferors, donors, testators, as the case may be; and to create such of open fund with the donations so received for the wolfare of the University;

- (f) to institute principalships, professorships, readerships, iecturerships, and to create other posts of any description required by the University and to appoint persons to such posts;
- (g) to co-operate with educational and other institutions in India and abroad having objectives similar to those of the University in such manner as may be conductive to their common goals;
- (h) to provide instructions, including correspondence and such other courses, to such persons as are not members of the University, as it may determine;
- to recognise persons for imparting instructions in any college or institution admitted to the privileges of the University;
- (j) to maintain colleges located within the limits of the area referred to in sub-section (1) of section 4 or subject to the provisions of sub-section (2) of that section, admit to its privileges colleges not maintained by the University but located within the said area and to withdraw the same:
- (b) to declare a college, an institution or a department as autonomous college or institution or department, as the case may be;
- (i) to borrow with the approval of the Government, on the security of the property of the University, money for the purposes of the University;
- (m) to supervise, control and regulate the residence, conduct and discipline of the students of the University and of colleges and institutions within the harisdiction of the University;
- (n) to deal with any property belonging to, or vested mile University, in such manner as the University may deem little advancing the objects of the University;
- (o) to assess the needs of the State and country in terms of subject fields of specialization, levels of education and training d manupower both on short and long term basis and to index necessary programmes to need those needs;
- to organize advanced studies and research programmes been on a deep understanding of the trends in such branches of least, as the University may think fit.
- (q) to promote research, design and developmental activities:

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have a relevance to social needs and the development programmes of the State:

- (a) to initiate measures to culist the essoperation of a dustries and Government employees to provide complementary facilities;
- to provide for continuous experimentation is imparting impowledge, organization of teaming and preparation of textbooks and other instructional materials;
- to arrange for progressive introduction of continuous evaluation and re-orientation of the subjects in educational invasurement;
- (u) to further entrepreneurial ability among its students:
- (v) to educate the public with regard to the requirement of, and opportunities for the advancement of learning and dissemination of knowledge;
- (w) to make special arrangements for the education of students and the students belonging to weaker sections of the society, in particular Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes as the University may consider desirable;
- (x) to frame Stantes, Ordinances or Regulations and after, modify or rescind the same for all or any of the aforesaid purposes; and
- (y) to do all such things as may be necessary, incidental or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the objects of the University.
- 7. The University shall be open to all women irrespective of race, creed, case or class; and no test or condition shall be unposed as to religion, belief or profession in admitting or appointing members, students, teachers, workers, or in any other connection whatsoever and no benefaction shall be accepted which in asception of the authorities of the University involves conditions or obligations expassed to the spirit and objectives of this provision:

University open to all races, castes and creeds

Provided that nothing contained in this section shall be deemed to pevent the University from making any special provisions in respect of weaker sections of the society and in particular Scheduled Castos and Scheduled Tribes.

8. All teaching in the University shall be conducted by and in the name at the University, in accordance with the Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations made in this behalf.

9. The following shall be the officers of the University namely:-

- (5) The Chancellor shall, in every case, give notice to the University of his intention to cause an inspection or inquiry to be made and on receipsuch notice, the University shall have the right to make such representation: Chancellor as it may consider necessary.
- (6) After considering the representation, if any, made by: University, the Chancellor may cause to be rande such inspection or inquiry: referred to in sub-section (4).
- (7) Where any inspection or inquiry has been caused to be made; the Chancellor, the University shall be catified to appoint a representative shall have the right to be present and to be heard at such inspection or ingli-

- The Executive Council shall communicate through the Chancellor to the Chancellor such action, if any, as it proposes to take & taken upon the result of such inspection or inquiry.
- (10) Where the Executive Council does not, within a reason time, take action to the satisfaction of the Chancellor, the Chancellor, mad considering any explanation furnished or representation made by the East Council, issue such directions as he may think fit and the Executive Council comply with such directions.

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r. may, and re Execusion Touncil still (11) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this section, set nanedlor, may by order in writing, annul any proceeding of the University, Eck in his opinion are not in conformity with this Agt, the Statutes of the Enunces:

Provided that before making any such order, he shall call upon the layersity to show cause why such an order should not be made, and if any cause shown within a reasonable time, he shall consider the same.

- (12) The Chancellor may, at any time, require or direct the University fact in conformity with the provisions of this Act and the Statutes. Ordinances ad Regulations made thereunder.
- (13) The powers exercised by the Chancetlor under sub-sections (11) and (12) shall not be called in question in any civil court.
- (14) Any employee of the University who is aggrieved by the Jecision of the Executive Council or the Vice-Chancellor in respect of any disciplinary action taken against him, may address a memorial to the Chancellor in such manner as may be prescribed by Statutes and the decision of the Chancellor shall to final.
- (15) The Chancellor shall have such other powers as may be sescribed by the Statutes.
- 11. (1) The Government shall constitute a Selection Committee consisting of one nominee of the Chancelior and two nominees of the Executive Council, which shall prepare a panel of at least three names, in alphabetical order, from which the Chancellor shall appoint the Vice-Chancellor, on the advice of the Government. The terms and conditions of service of the Vice-Chancellor, shall be determined by the Chancellor, on the advice of the Government.
- (2) The Chancellor may, on the advice of the Government, cause an inquiry to be held in accordance with the principles of natural justice, and remove the Vice-Chancellor from office, if she is found on such inquiry, to be a person patently unfit to be continued in such office.
- (3) The Vice-Chancellor shall hold office for a period of three years which may be renewed for not more than one term:

Provided that no person shall, be appointed to, or coatinue in, he office of the Vice-Chancellor if she has attained the age of sixty-five years.

(4) If the Vice-Chancellor is unable to perform her duties owing to be temporary incapacity on account of illness or any other reason, or the office of the Vice-Chancellor falls vacant due to death, resignation or otherwise, the Chancellor may make arrangement for the performance of dates of the Vice-Chancellor until the existing Vice-Chancellor is able to re-unreliev office or and a regular Vice-Chancellor is appointed, as the case may be.

- (5) The Vice-Chancellor shall be the principal executive are academic officer of the University and shall exercise general supervision are control over the affairs of the University and give effect to the decisions of all the university.
- (6) The Vice-Chancelior may, if she is of the opinion that immediate action is necessary on any matter, exercise at y power conferred on any authority of the University by or under this Act, except in the matters involving creation a abolition of a Faculty, Department, or post, the matter involving appointment or removal of an employee:

Provided that the Vice-Chancellor before exercising powers under this section shall record in writing the reasons, why the matter cannot wait till the meeting of the authority concerned:

Provided further that if the authority concerned is of the opinion the such action ought not to have been taken, it may refer the matter to the Chancellar whose decision thereon shall be final:

Provided further that any person in the service of the University who is aggrieved by the action taken by the Vino-Chancellor under this sub-section shall have the right to represent to the Liver arive Council within one mouth from the date on which decision on such action is communicated to him and thereupes the Executive Council may confirm, modify or reverse the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor. The employee shall be informed that the action has been taken under emergency powers.

(7) The Vice-Chancellor shall exercise such other powers aid perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Statutes or Ordinances.

- (1) The Registrar shall be appointed by the Chancellor on the advice of the Government.
- (2) The Registrar shall be the Chief Administrative Officer of the University. She shall work directly under the superintendence, direction self control of the Vice-Chancellor.

Statutes and their scope.

- 22. Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Statutes may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely: -
 - (a) the constitution, powers and functions of the authorities and other bodies of the University as may be constituted from time to time;
 - the classification, mode of appointment, powers and duties of the teachers and the officers of the University;
 - (c) the conditions of the service including provision for pensions provident fund or insurance scheme for the benefit of the employees of the University;
 - (d) the conferment of honorary degrees;
 - (e) the establishment and agolition of Faculties and Department
 - (i) the institution of fellowships scholarships, studentships exhibitions, nichals and prizes.
 - (μ)—the maintenance of discipline among the students;
 - (b) the conditions under w in colleges and institutions may adoutted to the privileges of the University and the withdraw of the same;
 - (i) the delegation of powers vested in the authorities or officers the University; and
 - (j) all other matters which by this Act, are to be or may be provided, by the Statutes.

Framing of Statutes.

23. (1) On the commencement of this Act, the Statutes of the University shall be those as set out in the Schedule;

Provided that the authorities of the University constituted under Statutes framed before the commencement of this Act shall continue to exerall the powers and perform all the functions under this Act this such authorities constituted in terms of the Statutes set out in the Schedule referred to above

(2) The Government or the Executive Council may, from him time, make new or additional statutes or may amend or repeal the statutes manner hereinafter provided in this section:

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Provided that the Executive Council shall not melle, amend or repeal any Statute, affecting the status, powers or constitution of any authority of the University until such authority has been given an opportunity of expressing an opinion in writing on the proposed changes, and any opinion so expressed shall be considered by the Executive Council.

- (3) The Academic Council may propose to the Executive Council a critical any Statute relating to academic matters for consideration by the Executive Council.
- (4) Every new Statute or addition to the Statute or any amendment expected of a statute shall require the approval of the Chancellor who may approve, asapprove or remit it for further consideration. A Statute passed by the Government of the Executive Council shall have no validity until it has been assented to by one Chancellor.
- .(5) Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing subgetions, the Chancellor, either suo more or on the advice of the Government, may direct the Executive Council, to make, amend or repeal the Statutes in respect slasy matter specified by him and if the Executive Council fails to implement such a direction within sixty days of its receipt, the Chancellor may, after a sadering the reasons, if any, communicated by the Executive Council for its inability to comply with such direction, make, amend or repeal the Statutes satably.

24. Subject to the provisions of this Act and the Statutes, the Orginances may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:-

- the admission of students to the University and the reproductive as such;
- (b) the admission to the examinations, degrees and diplor as of the University and further to make progressively the fee structure so flexible that the courses could become self-financing to the extent possible;
- (c) the conditions under which students shall be admitted to the degree or diploma courses and to the examinations of the University and the eligibility for such degrees and diplomas;
- (d) the fees to be charged for courses of study in the University and for admission to the examinations, degrees and diplomas of the University; and further to make progressively the fee structure so flexible that the courses could become self-financing to the extent possible;
- the conditions of the award of fellowships, studentships, exhibitions, medals and prizes;

Ordinances and their scope.

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- the conduct of examinations, including the terms of office and (1)manner of appeintment and the duties of examining bodies. examiners and moderators.
- the conditions of residence of students of the University; and
- all other matters which by this Act or the Statutes are to be made (h) or may be provided for by the Ordinances.

Framing of ordinances.

25. (D) The Ordinances shall be made, amended, repealed or added to by the Executive Council.

Provided that no Ordinance shall be made-

- affecting the admission or enrolment of students, or prescribing ΔĎ examinations to be recognized as equivalent to the University examinations; and
- affecting the conditions, mode of appointment or duties of examiners of the conduct of tandard of examination or any courses of study; unless the draft of such an Ordinance has been proposed by the Academic Council.
- The Everntive Conneil may return to the Academic Council for reconsideration, either in whole or in part, any digit proposed by the Academic Council under sub-section (1) alone with its suggestions:

Provided that the Executive Council shall not amend the draft proposed by the Academic Council itself. It may, however, reject such draft when submitted to it by the Academic Coancil for the second time.

All Ordinances made by the Executive Council shall have effect from such date as it may direct and every Ordinance made shall be communicated. as soon as may be, to the Chancellor.

Regulations

- 26. (1) The anthorities of the University may make Regulation consistent with this Act, the Statutes and the Ordinances
 - laying down the procedure to be observed at their racetings; and
 - providing for all matters which by this Act, the Statutes & the Ordinances are to be prescribed by Regulations.

27. The annual report of the University giving details of broad programms. policies and finances, amendments of State and Ordinances made during the year under report, shall be prepared under the directions of the Executive Count

If any difficulty arises with respect to the establishment of University or in connection with the first treating of any authority of the University or in first giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the Governance may, at any time, before any authority of the University has been constituted order, make any appointment or do anything, consistent, so far as may be, with provisions of this Act, which appears to it necessary or expedient for the pupply of removing the difficulty, and every such order shall have effect as it appointment or action had been made or taken in the manner provided at Act.

Mode of proof of University record.

34. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the life. Evidence Act. 1872 (1 of 1872), or in any other law for the time being in force copy of any receipt, application, notice, order, proceedings, resolution of authority or committee of the University, or other documents in possessional University, or any entry in any register duly maintained by the University certified by the Registrar, shall be received as evidence of such receipt, applied notice, order, proceedings, resolution, document or the existence of entry register and shall be admitted as evidence of the matters and transactions and where the original thereof would, if produced, have been admissible in evidence

Protection of action taken in good faith

35. No suit or other legal proceedings shall lie against any offine employee of the University for anything which is in good faith done or ince to be done in pursuance of any of the provisions of this Act, the States Ordinances.

Vesting of properties.

- 36. (1) All properties, movable or immovable and all the interest whatsoever nature and kind therein, vested in the institutions of Make Gurukul Vidyapeeth Hargana, Bhar swill Kalan and Kanya Gurukul, Kalan and the courses run thereunder and the posts created, filled before commencement of this Act, shall yest in the University.
- (2) All debts, obligations and liabilities incurred, all medientered into and all matters and things engaged to be done by the Mahal Gurukul Vidyapeeth Haryana, Bhataswal Kalan and Kanya Gurekul, khe Kalan relating to its institutions shall be deemed to have been incurred, and into, or engaged to be done by, with or for the University.

Repeal and saving

- 37. (1) Bhagat Phoof Singh Mahila Vishwavidyalaya Khanput Ordinance, 2006 (Haryana Ordinance No.4 of 2006), is hereby repealed.
- (2) Notwithstanding such repeal, anything done or any action under the said Ordinance shall be deemed to have been done or taken this Act.

- (h) to provide buildings, premises, furniture and apparatus and other means needed, for carrying on the work of the University;
- (i) to select a common seal for the University;
- (j) to delegate any of its powers to the Vice-Chancellor, the Registrar or such other employee or authority of the University or to a committee appointed by it, as it may deem fit
- (k) to enter into, vary, carry out, or cancel contracts on behalf of the University;
- to make, amend or repeal the Statutes;
- (m) to make decisions regarding maintenance of discipline among students;
- (n) to exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as may be conferred or imposed on the Executive Council by the Act or the Statutes or the Ordinances; and
- (o) to exercise all powers of the University not otherwise provided for by the Act, the Statutes, or the Ordinances.

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14. The Academic Council shall consist of the following persons.

Charpersons of Departments

22. (1) Hach traching department shall have a Chairperson who shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor for a period of three years by rotation

- (a) if a Department has two or more Professors, the Chairpersonship shall rotate by seniority only among the professors; provided that a Professor appointed as Chairman shall get her next turn after all the Professors in the Department have been appointed as Chairperson in order of their seniority;
- (b) if a Department has only one Professor, the Chairpersonship shall rotate between the Professor and the senior-most Reader:
- (c) if a Department has no Professor, the Chairpersonshipshale resiste between the two sentor-most Readers;
- (d) the Vice-Chancellor if the considers it necessary for an administrative reason, may deviate from the principle of sentority, in which case she shall report the matter to the Executive Council at its next meeting.
- (2) In the case of a Department where no teacher is eligible for appointment as Chairperson or for such Departments where instruction is impassionly upto the under-graduate level in the colleges, the Dean of the concerns', Faculty shall be the Chairperson.

Provided further that a teacher who has been nominated as a member of the Faculty shall not be nominated under this sub-clause;

(v) two outside experts to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of the Chairperson of the Department.

Provided that the lixecurive Council at the request of the Academic Council may increase the number of members of a Board of under-graduate Studies, under sub-clause (iv) above.

- 3) The Board of post-goadque Studies and Research shall part of
 - (i) the Chairperson of the Department;
 - (ii) all the Professors appointed or recognized by the University in the Department;
 - (iii) two readers and two leaturers appointed or recognized by the University in the Department to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor by rotation according to seniority;

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(v) two teachers including the Heads of the Post-Graduale Departments in women colleges admitted to the privileges of the University in the subject concerned with at least ten years teaching experience, out of which five years shall be as a Post-Graduate Degree teacher, to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor, by rotation recording to semority to be determined by the length of Post-Graduate teaching experience;

Provided that if the number of women colleges having Post-Graduate Department is more than six, then one more teacher of the subject concerned shall be nominated but not more than one such member shall be from the same college:

 (v) two outside experts to be nominated by the Vice-Chanceller, on the recommendation of the Chairman of the Department

Provided that the Executive Council at the request of the Academic Council, may increase the number of members of a Board of post-graduate Studies under sub-clause (iv) above.

- (4) (i) The Board of under-graduate Studies shall recommend to the Academic Council, through the Faculty concerned, courses and syllabi of studies and text books for the various subjects for under-graduate courses and the Board of posgraduate Studies shall make such recommendations in respect of the courses for Post-Graduate classes and Research Degrees.
 - (ii) The Boards of Studies shall also make recommendations:
 the Academic Council, regarding the appointments of pagesetters and examiners for the under-graduate or the potgraduate courses, as the case may be.
 - (iii) The Board of Studies shall deal with any other matter that may be referred to them by the Faculty. The Chairperson of the Board the Department shall be the Chairperson of the Board Members, other than ex-scale orientbers, shall hold offact for a term of two years:

Provided that a person whose book or any othe publication is to be the subject of consideration before its Board, shall not be attached to the Board:

Provided further that a person who, in one way ortal other, is involved in publication of cheap notes, guides a help books shall not be eligible to be a member of a Best of Studies.

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31. A degree, diploma, certificate and other academic distinctions may so althdrawn by the University-

- (a) if the candidature of the person concerned has been amounted or result quashed in accordance with the manner hald Jown by the Ordinance; or
- (b) if the candidate has misbehaved at a convocation of the University; provided that the question whether a person has misbehaved in terms of this Statute shall be finally decided by the Vice-Chancellor; or
- (c) when sufficient evidence is laid before the Academic Council showing that any person on whom a degree or diploma etc. was conferred by the University has been convicted of what is in their opinion a serious offence, the Academic Council may recommend to the Executive Council that such a degree or diploma be cancelled.

32. Approval, recognition to a teacher may be withdrawn by the University-

- (a) if the teacher fails to perform duties in accordance, with the manner laid down by the Ordinanees;
- (b) if sufficient enidence is laid before the Executive Council that the teacher has committed an act which in their opinion is a serious offence, the Executive Council may withdraw approval, recognition of the teacher.

33. The University shall provide for the benefits of its officers, teachers and other employees, gratuity, exegratia grant etc. on the patter i of the Gavernment.

34. The number and value of followships, scholarships, medats and prizes to be awarded shall be determined by the Executive Council either or its own isitiative or on the recommendations of the Academic Council or the Finance Committee.

Notwithstanding anything contained in these Statutes, a person. the is a member of any authority or body of the University in her capacity as a gember of a particular authority or body or as a holder of particular appointment. sall hold office so long only as she continues to be a member of that particular Exactly or body of the holder of that particular appointment, as the case may be:

Provided that a teacher-member of any authority or lody of the University who resigns her service or proceeds on leave for six month; or more stall cease to be a member of the respective body and a sub-route snall be agained. If the period of her leave is less than six months, her membership shall is held in abeyance till her return or the expiry of the period of six months,

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whichever is later. No substitute member shall be appointed or elected, where the membership is hold in abeyance.

(2) If a teacher is on leave for a period of six months or more, the abull not be eligible for nonmation or re-election for that particular vacancy. Six shall, however, be eligible for nomination or at store in a vacancy which may associate her return from leave.

Termination of mulbership etc.

36. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Statutes or the Ordinances of the University, no person, who has been convicted of any offence involving moral terpitude or has been dismissed for inseconduct from a Government or Semi-Government institution or from a University or an educational institution of any kind, shall be eligible to become, or to continue as a member of any authority of the University or of any committee appointed by the University. A person under suspension shall not be allowed to sit in any meeting of the above authorities or committees during the period of her suspension.

Disqualification of membership.

37. If a person is debarred by the Academic Council from any work of the University on account of any kind of malpractice on her patt in connection with a University examination, such a person shall be disqualified to become, or to continue as a member of any body or authority of the University so long as the bar lasts.

Delegation of administrative and financial powers to the officers/ teachers/ employees

- 38. (1) The officers, teachers and other employees of the University may exercise, subject to the control of the Vice-Chancellor and the superior officers concerned, such administrative and/or financial powers, as the Executive Council may delegate through Ordinances or Rules or Regulations or by resolutions adopted by it.
- (2) The Vice-Chancellor or the Registral with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor, may delegate to an officer, teacher or any other employee of the University such powers as she considers necessary which have been vested in them by the Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations.

"(3) The University shall not, itself or through franchise or agency, operate or open any off campus centre and study centre:

(i) "off campus centre" means a centre of the University, by whatever name called, established by it outside the main campus, operated and maintained as its constituent unit,

having the University's complement of facilities, faculty and staff; and

(ii) "study centre" means a centre, by whatever name called, established and maintained or recognized by the University for the purpose of advising, counselling or for rendering any other assistance required by the students in the context of distance education.".
