[THE EPIDEMIC DISEASES (BOMBAY AMENDMENT) ACT, 1953.]

[18th April 1953]

An Act to amend the Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897, in its application to the State of Bombay.

111 of WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897, in its 1897. application to the State of Bombay, for the purpose hereinafter appearing; It is hereby enacted as follows :—

1. This Act may be called the Epidemic Diseases (Bombay Amendment) Act, Short title. 1953.

"2B. The State Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, Delegation of direct that the powers exercisable by it under section 2 shall, subject to such condi-powers. tions, if any, as may be specified in the notification, be exercisable also by the Collectors within their respective jurisdiction."
